LOS ANGELES POLICE COMMISSION AND POLICING PROJECT SEEK PUBLIC INPUT ON POLICY FOR RELEASING VIDEO CAMERA FOOTAGE

The Los Angeles Police Commission and the Policing Project announced plans for establishing policies for the release of video footage taken following critical incidents, including officer involved shootings. The Police Commission seeks to work closely with the public. Input will be gathered in community forums around Los Angeles, and through a questionnaire available online. The questionnaire will be available in English and Spanish, at www.lapdvideo.org. The survey is anonymous and only takes a few minutes to complete.

The LAPD currently deploys body cameras worn by patrol officers, and expects to issue cameras to all patrol officers on the force by the end of 2017. Currently, the LAPD does not release videos of critical incidents except when used in trial or by order of a court. The L.A. Police Commission and LAPD seek broad-based community engagement to form a policy for public release of footage after critical incidents.
