# THE BIG IDEA Shatto Place Redesign & Beautification


# THE BIG IDEA

Creating streets that are meant for people.

The City of Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) has been awarded a \$250,000 California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) grant to redesign Shatto Place, which is wide and experiences high vehicle volumes and speeds, into a pedestrian/bicycle-friendly, vehicle-calmed, and greened corridor. The goal is to enhance safety, cooling, comfort, and quality of life for the school, business, transit area, and active mobility community members.

The Caltrans grant will fund quick-to-install materials known as a Quick Build project. The Quick Build installation is an opportunity to trial these beautification improvements while concurrently soliciting feedback from the local community, and collecting and evaluating data. Installing quick build elements will support the design and funding steps for the more permanent build-out of project area.
